The International Mass Spectrometry Foundation and the Organizing Committee of the 24th International Mass Spectrometry Conference invite nominations for the Jochen Franzen Award to be made on the occasion of the IMSC2022 in Maastricht, the Netherlands, August 27 - September 2, 2022. The prize, of EUR 5,000 is generously sponsored by *Bruker* and will be made to an individual for “*outstanding contributions to innovations in structural, spatial and/or separation analysis with mass spectrometry*”.

Nominations may be made by individual scientists or by national mass spectrometry societies, but self-nominations are not acceptable.

Nominations should consist of a nomination letter stating the candidate’s achievements, one seconding letter, and supporting material. The total documentation is not to exceed 10 pages.

Deadline for receipt of nominations is April 30th, 2022
